Print and save the picture to share with your teacher. Re read any book from your box	Read 2 picture books and add them to your box. Write about your favorite book.	Read another Fairy Tale book.
Find a children's recipe with mom or dad for a healthy dessert. Read and make the recipe together!	Have an adult help you log on to storylineonline.net Listen to a story	Read a non fiction book about animals. List 5 facts in a sentence and share this with an adult.	Take a picture of you reading and write about it.	Take another trip to the library and check out some more books!	Ask an adult to print 4 photos or cut out some magazine pictures. Begin creating a story book. Make a title page too!	Work on your story book using the four photos or magazine pictures. Make sure you write about each picture!
Finish up your story book using the four photos or magazine pictures.	Read the story book you created to a friend.	Go the library. Draw a picture of you reading in the children's section. Label it.	Ask an adult to visit ReadingRockets.org and share with you what they learned about reading!	Ask your mom or dad to log on to story line on line. Listen to a story together!
